







## At present for a sustainable livestock sector, there is not ...




- one single answer

#### Developments and Achievements

- Consultation process started in 2010 (FAO COAG)
- 5 MSPs: Brazil (May 2011), Thailand (December 2011), Kenya (January 2013), Canada (October 2013), Cali (October 2014)
   (from environmental focus, to "full sustainability", to SDGs)
- Other
  - Pivot to SDGs
  - Rules and Procedures
  - Active Guiding Group
  - Development of seven Clusters

## Developments and Achievements (cont'd)

- $\circ$  The Global Agenda exists!! (and is growing)
- Brought diverse stakeholders together: consensus, integrated approach, shared vision (Narrative)
- 'Key messages' developed
- Action networks: FA1, FA2, FA3, Dairy Asia, GNSPS, LEAP, ......
- NRU efficiency matrix; Grasslands pilots database; Manure kiosk; Enteric methane;
   LEAP guidelines
- Presentations (Berlin, Manila, Beijing, Milan EXPO, Geneva, .....)
- Investment roundtable, Fribourg
- Linkages: GACSA, LRG of GRA, PKH

#### Action Plan 2016-2018

## Funding Needs

- O 2016-2018 Budget: US \$5.3 Million (based on Action Plan approved November, 2015)
- US3.8M is core budget, US\$1.5M seed money for action (AN or national activities)
- Available funds 2016: US \$805,000









- o Gap: US \$4.5 Million
- Fundraising Task Force established
