Access and availability

Access and availability

Promote availability through balanced measures that favor development of local markets and facilitate trade + ensure sustainability through appropriate pricing

- Produce evidence on real value/role of local markets (incl. informal mkt.)
- Assess effects of policies in promoting or restricting access to quality food produced in a sustainable way.
- Develop tools to measure the real cost of ASF (internalizing the externalities)

Include women and youth in value chain development

- Produce evidence on the opportunities for women and youth

Investment in appropriate infrastructure



Global multi-stakeholder partnership activities

1. Linking to data and knowledge repository
2. Provide a platform for members (knowledge sharing, advocacy..)
3. Building new partnerships (consumers groups, retailers, other value chain actors...)

Local, national and regional multi-stakeholder partnerships


1. Facilitate networking by using convening power
 2. MSP dialogues at regional and country levels
 3. Linking GASL to global public and private institutions, fora and research networks
 4. Allow more inclusive participation & empowerment (e.g. social movements, indigenous peoples, producers, consumers...)
 5. Allow context-specific discussions and solutions

Linking GASL to global public and private institutions, fora and research networks

1. Reach out to UN and other fora dealing with nutrition for evidence and knowledge information
2. Use convening power to bring together expertise from different fields around nutrition
3. Advocacy to integrate livestock issues, raise awareness in global debates and forums
4. Build on members' network in order to reach other for a/institutions...

Communication

1. Regular newsletter
 2. Actively spread news about GASL work and overall sustainable LS using social media strategically
 3. Design ways of reaching out to Millennials
 4. Production of white papers and policy briefs (but: issue of inclusiveness/consensus!)
